### IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS FOR CANDIDATES SHORTLISTED FOR STAGE-II OF CGEPT 01/2022 BATCH

- 1. The Stage-II examination is scheduled from 16-18 Nov 21 at 09 examination centre. Please <u>Click here (Encl I)</u> for list of examination city and center addresses.
- 2. Maximum number of candidates are allocated centres as per their sequence of choices filled in the application. In case, candidate is not allotted examination centre as per their choice, then no request for centre change will be entertained. The candidate has to appear for Stage-II examination at the allotted centre examination only.
- 3. Mumbai examination centre have been changed/shifted to Goa. The candidates who have filled Mumbai as their choice of centre will be allotted Goa as examination centre if feasible administratively.
- 4. Initial medical examination at Stage-II exam is cancelled by Competent Authority. No initial medical examination will be conducted at Stage-II of CGEPT 01/2022. Only final medicals of shortlisted candidates will be conducted during Stage-III of CGEPT-01/2022.
- 5. Candidates will be able to download E-admit card of Stage-II from 01 Nov 21 (1500 hrs) till 18 Nov 21(1700 hrs).
- 6. Candidates will be able to upload additional documents and make changes in marks and subjects for class 10<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup> and diploma in edit window of candidates login from 01 Nov 21 (1500hrs) till 08 Nov 21 (1500 hrs), failing which the candidate will not be able to download the E-admit card for Stage-II exam. An edit window is opened in candidates login IDs for editing subject and aggregate percentage in 10<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup> and diploma. Candidates to understand the rules for editing marks and subjects in edit window. Please Click here (Encl II) for various examples regarding rules for aggregate percentage verification.
- 7. E-admits card for stage II will be downloaded only if candidate completes the following:-
  - (a) Editing of marks and subject for class 10<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup> and diploma as applicable in edit window in candidates login ID.
  - (b) Uploading of additional documents.
- 8. The detailed procedure and rules for document verification for Stage-II to be followed are as follows: -
  - (a) All the information provided in the online application has to match with all the original documents like grade X/XII/ Diploma marksheet/photo Identity card/caste certificate/individual subject and aggregate. Any inconsistency in all the documents and application with respect to "name, date of birth, parent's name, percentage of marks, validity of documents, caste certificate details etc." will lead to failure in document verification and the candidature will be cancelled. The date of issue of all documents has to be the closing date of application or any date prior to closing date of application. The validity of all the

uploaded documents has to be at least up to 30 Apr 22 or as decided by ICG. In case of any mismatch of information provided in the application form, document uploaded (at online application stage-I and II) and original documents produced for physical verification at Stage-II than the candidature will be cancelled.

- **Note**: (i) If the candidate records the percentage (upto 03 decimal places without rounding off) lower than the actual percentage in Class X, XII and Diploma then the candidate will be declared 'fail' in document verification. Also, if the candidate records the percentage (upto 03 decimal places without rounding off) higher than the actual percentage in Class X, XII and Diploma then the candidate will be declared 'fail' in document verification.

- (c) Wrong upload of documents in the online application will lead to the cancellation of the candidature. For example:-Uploading of class 10<sup>th</sup> marksheet in the column of class 12<sup>th</sup> marksheet or uploading of caste certificate in the photograph column or any other column apart from the specified column.
- 9. The candidates are to produce following at the entrance gate of the examination center, failing which their candidature will be cancelled and they will not be allowed to enter the examination premises.
  - (a) Coloured print out of of (Page 1-2) and (Encl I & III) of E-admit card of Stage-II (02 Copies).
  - (b) Coloured print out of Online Application.
  - (c) Original Photo ID card as mentioned on the E-admit card.
  - (d) Negative COVID-19 RT-PCR report issued by government approved testing laboratories. The COVID-19 RT-PCR test should be undertaken by the candidate not more than 96 hours prior to the reporting date and time for Stage-II examination as mentioned in the E-admit card. SMS report regarding negative RT-PCR test may also be considered for allowing entry to the candidate.
  - (e) Self-declaration COVID-19 form (Encl. III of E-admit card)
  - (f) No risk/ claim undertaking (<u>Encl. I of E-admit card</u>)

- 10. The candidate has to submit following documents while appearing for Stage II of the Recruitment Procedure during document verification: -
  - (a) Coloured printout of following:-
    - (i) Online application
    - (ii) (Page 1-2) and (Encl I & III) of E- Admit card of stage II (02 coloured copies).
  - (b) Original Photo ID card as mentioned on application.
  - (c) Original educational and category {SC/ST/OBC(Non-creamy layer)/EWS} documents as directed for upload in the online application form and original additional documents directed for upload at stage II.
  - (d) 03 duly self-attested photo copies of all original documents as uploaded in online application and after declaration of Stage-I result.
  - (e) 20 in nos. passport size colour photograph as with similar facial features as uploaded in online application.
  - \*(f) SC/ST/ OBC (non- creamy) / EWS candidates to bring original "expired and renewed" caste certificate as applicable and 02 photocopy of self-attested old as well as renewed category certificate.
  - (g) NOC in original and 4 self-attested photocopy from the employer for candidates presently serving in any government organization (if applicable).
  - (h) Domicile certificate of relevant state/union territory is required only if claiming relaxation in height {Note- (i) & (ii) mentioned at para 14(c) relevant}. Domicile certificate is not required for candidates not eligible to claim relaxation in height.
- \*Note:- (i) The candidates are to mandatorily produce old and renewed certificates {EWS, ST, SC & OBC (non-creamy)} with validity at least up to 30 Apr 22 at stage II, if they have the renewed certificate.

**Note**: (i) The rules for filling in the semester wise details will also be on similar lines as explained above for year wise result.

- (ii) The candidates whose result is in the form of grade or CGPA should also follow the same rule as mentioned wherein they shall put in the marks of all the subject as considered by respective Board for calculation of grade or CGPA. They are to mandatorily upload the conversion formula prior Stage-II as published on the ICG recruitment website or in candidate's dashboard from time to time. Non-upload of conversion formula prior Stage-II will lead to cancellation of candidature.
- (iii) If the candidate has a diploma of only two years then he should be mandatorily passed in Class X as well as Class XII. However, the mismatch of percentage filled in online application for Class X & Class XII will not be the reason for rejection of candidate.
